Heartland regularly produce full flavoured reds and this, their entry level shiraz, is value plus. It's from Langhorne Creek and is a medium bodied wine with a quite noticeable dark chocolate and spice character, which gives the generous dark fruit backbone a real lift. It has good balance and, with fine tannins, is easy drinking.

Heartland's owners, Ben Glaetzer, Grant Tilbrook and Scott Collett acknowledge the influence of Glaetzer's uncle, John Glaetzer, in drawing most of their fruit from Langhorne. As long-time Wolf Blass winemaker, John Glaetzer exploited the clear varietal character and plush mid-palate of the region's red varieties. John now assesses and buys grapes for Heartland and nephew Ben makes the wines. In the warm 2013 vintage, Heartland shiraz shows the rich, ripe and soft side of shiraz, with sufficient tannin to give structure and drinking satisfaction.

A wine of dense, layered black fruit. The aromas of anise are enveloped in classic blackberry. The glass-coating texture gives way to freshness on the finish, resulting in a fine balance. The structure imparted by oak and skin contact integrates well with the bright, but intense fruit.
